WATER VALVE AND HYDRANT OPERATIONS

From April to October Water Distribution Staff complete maintenance activities that include water valve and hydrant operations. Hydrants are used to flush the watermains and to verify proper operation of the hydrants. These tasks improve water quality by removing any sediment that may accumulate in the distribution pipes over time. Fluctuations in water colour and pressure may temporarily occur but are not a water quality concern. Flush coloured water by turning on the cold water tap until the water runs clear.

HOLIDAY GARBAGE AND RECYCLING COLLECTION

Due to Statutory Holidays, Wednesday and Thursday Garbage/Recycling Collection will be delayed by one day the weeks of December 23rd and 30th.

There will be no changes to Tuesday's collection.



ENVIRONMENTAL Initiatives

Garbage

Residents can set out two complimentary garbage bags per week without garbage tags. Additional bags require one garbage tag per bag, and must be affixed to the bag. Garbage tags are \$3.00 each and can be purchased at Town Hall or at Andress' Your Independent Grocer customer service. Garbage must be set out by 7:00 a.m. on your scheduled collection day.

Household Hazardous Waste

Hazardous waste can be taken to the Household Hazardous Waste Site at 128 Patterson Crescent, Carleton Place. The site is open on Saturday from 8:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. between May 18, 2024, and August 31, 2024. Visit www. smithsfalls.ca/hhw to view a list of acceptable materials. This is a free service to all Smiths Falls residents. You are required to show identification and proof of residency. Town Hall and the Smiths Falls Public Library accept household batteries.

Construction Waste

The Town does not collect construction waste. The closest approved collection facility for construction waste is Glenview Iron & Metal (613-283-5230). The REAL Deal Reuse Store (613-283-7999) accepts good quality drywall, lumber and other construction materials.

Large Items

Large items require 2 garbage tags per item and must be set out on your regular scheduled collection day. Large items include furniture, kitchen appliances (not metal goods) and items that do not fit in a garbage bag.

Metal Goods Pick Up

The Town collects metal goods on the last Friday of each month (unless otherwise noted on the calendar). Metal goods must be set out by 7:00 a.m. on collection day. Metal goods include but are not limited to stoves, fridges/freezers, washers/dryers, and dishwashers. Fridges and freezers must have a Freon Free sticker. Please contact the Town to inform them of your item(s) for pick up.

Electronic Waste

Electronic waste items can be recycled at the following facilities located in Smiths Falls:

Apollo Computers, 3 Russell Street West, 613-284-2446

Computer components and cellphones only.

REAL Deal Reuse Store, 85 William Street West, 613-283-7999

Monitors, TV's, desktop computers, laptops, printers, photocopiers, telephone and answering machines, cellphones, audio/video devices, small appliances, and camcorders.

Yard Waste & Brush Collection (Spring and Fall)

Collection of brush, leaves and grass clippings (yard waste) will take place the second week of May and the third week of November. All yard waste must be placed in brown compostable paper bags and be free from any garbage. Brush must be neatly bundled with no branches larger than 4 inches (10 cm) in diameter.

Tire Disposal

A provincial program now places the responsibility of used tire disposal onto the manufacturers and importers of tires. Residents can contact local tire dealerships to determine if they recycle tires.

Paint Disposal

Disposal of empty dry paint cans can go into your yellow/black recycling bin with the lid off. Partially used paint cans can go to Rona located at 136 Lombard Street. Please call Rona first at 613-283-4411 to confirm they can receive the unused paint. Alternatively, unused paint can be disposed of at the Household Hazardous Waste site.

Composting

The Town operates a Compost Site located at 3514 Highway 43 (east of Hillcrest Cemetery). The Compost Site is open on:

- Saturday from 8:00 a.m. 4:00 p.m. from May 11, 2024 to November 23, 2024
- Wednesday from 9:00 a.m. 3:00 p.m. from May 8, 2024 June 26, 2024

Acceptable materials include leaves, brush and yard waste. All leaves must be in brown paper bags and free from garbage. No branches larger than 4 inches (10 cm) in diameter will be accepted. Residents are welcome to take some compost material for their gardens when available. Food and kitchen waste are not accepted at this facility.

Backyard composters are available for purchase at Town Hall for \$45.00.

Swap Days

Swap Days are on the second weekend of May and the second weekend of August. Place your "good condition" used items at the back of curb or sidewalk

to give away starting on Friday. If your items haven't been picked up by Sunday at noon, please bring them back inside.

Containers One Week (Yellow/Black Box)

PLASTIC

- #1 #7 Plastic food & drink containers & plastic egg cartons (NOT #6 polystyrene/Styrofoam)
 - Detergent Bottles
 - Bakery, meat and takeout trays with recycling number GLASS
- Food and beverage jars and bottles (Return deposit containers for refund)
 METAL
 - Aluminum (foil/trays/plates)
 - Metal paint cans
 (Empty, dry & lids removed)
 - Cans (empty food, hair spray, cleaners, air fresheners, etc.)
 GABLE TOPS AND TETRA PAKS
 - Dairy Containers
 - Drink Boxes

It is necessary to rinse all containers where possible.

Please note that depending on availability recycle bins supplied for container collection may be black or yellow



Fibres Other Week (Blue Box)

PAPER

- Newspapers & flyers
 (Plastic bags removed)
- Magazines, catalogues, calendars, junk mail, office & shredded paper
- Telephone books, reading books (Hard covers removed)
 - Clean paper shopping bags or paper packaging
 - Egg cartons (paper)
 - Envelopes (remove plastic window prior to recycling)

BOXBOARD

- Cereal and other food boxes, tissue boxes, shoe boxes
- Paper rolls from paper towel and toilet paper

CARDBOARD

- Corrugated boxes
 (Flattened and bundled)
- Pizza boxes (Clean)




Garbage Every Week

GARBAGE

- Styrofoam (#6 polystyrene)
- Paper coffee cup & waxed cardboard
 - Plastic bags (grocery, Zip-lock & all film plastic)
 - Flower/plant pots & trays
- · Chip bags and candy bar wrappers
- Non-food container metal, plastic or glass (like clothes hangers, toys, dishes)
- Broken glass, windows, lights bulbs*
 - Soiled paper
 - Reports with plastic spines
 - · Pizza boxes with food residue

If disposing of broken glass, wrap in paper or place in a box to ensure sharp edges are contained prior to placing in your garbage.

The Town operates a two stream recycling system. Fibers (cardboard, newspaper, etc.) are to be placed at the curb in your Blue Box, and containers (plastic bottles, cans, etc) are to be placed at the curb in your Yellow/or Black Box. Recycling collection alternates each week, with fibers being picked up one week and containers the next. Recycling must be set out by 7:00 a.m. on your scheduled collection day.
