In the coming year, the Community Policing and Safety Act (replacing the Police Services Act of Ontario) will bring upon changes within the policing model.

However, with these changes our motto remains the same- Community First. Community engagement has been and will continue to be important to me and to our members. We will continue to strive to put our community first through initiatives such as having a full time Community Services Officer who engages with several committees such as Situation Table, RNJ, Big Brothers We are kids for youth program, Diversity and Inclusion, schools and service clubs. We also dedicate our full team to continue to interact with our youth in schools on a regular basis. That positive interaction is so important for our youth to see and be able to ask them anything they wanted to know.



Collaborating with our Community Partners is also a very important piece. Through partnerships with services such as Victim Services, Victim Advocates, LCIH, school boards, our MCRT team, LCMH, LGBTQ2S+, Smiths Falls for all, restorative justice, homelessness, RNJ services are just some of the partnerships we work with to assist with supporting our most vulnerable.

Proactive response to Policing is the most fundamental way of crime prevention, such as our ongoing road safety initiatives, ride programs, compliance checks of our highrisk offenders, patrols on foot and on bike throughout our communities and parks. Most of our Officers have worked in this community for several years and know our community and the problem areas.

As you read our Strategic Plan, it serves as a Commitment to our community. Redeveloping our Mission, Visions and Values was from listening to the needs of our Community.

As our Community continues to grow and evolve, so do we. Information and technology has been faster than ever. Instant information such as social media, has changed quite substantially. How we investigated cases now and their complexity has changed. Digital evidence has become a key component to our workload.

Our Strategic Plan and the feedback we received ensures that we enhance our service levels while continuing to be mindful of budgetary and staffing challenges. Utilizing grant opportunities for Victims of Crime, NG 911, Crime Prevention, Criminal Intelligence, Human Trafficking for example, are just some of the ways of cost preventative measures but also be able to support our community partners within our community.

Most importantly, the plan recognizes the health and wellness of our employees. It's important for the Police Services Board to understand the challenges of this profession and ensuring the staff is supported.

I am honored to have worked my entire 30 year career here in Smiths Falls with the men and women who have dedicated themselves to this service and partnering with a community that does want to work together to make this town a safe place to live in.


POLICE SERVICE BOARD CHAIR





Smiths Falls is located in Eastern Ontario on the historic Rideau Canal Approximately 1 hour from ottawa and Kingston. The population of Smiths Falls according to 2022 statistics was over 9,500 and growing. Smiths Falls has seen a growing population of apartment buildings and housing within the last couple of years.

Smiths Falls has all three emergency services within the town limits- police, fire and ambulance. It has easy access to beautiful cataraqui trails as well as many parks.

The town of Smiths Falls has a number of attractions throughout the year such as festivals, Rib Fest Station Theatre, two local golf courses - one home to Brooke and Brittany Henderson, Museums such as the Heritage House, Railway and Rideau Canal. Smiths Falls is also home to Le Boat, Tweed and soon to be the Hershey Factory again.

In addition to these highlights, the town also has the Gerry Lowe Memorial outdoor rink, outdoor volleyball, pickleball, basketball, and tennis courts as well as a large arena with two rink pads and a walking track. If you drive through the beautiful town you will see a lot of old properties that have been re-done as has the down town core.

There are many local restaurants and businesses in town where locals and tourists alike can shop and eat at a wide variety of restaurants.



Principles of sensitivity and compassion for victims of crime


Principles of continuous improvement and education of members of the Smiths Falls Police Service

Crime Prevention and Crime Severity

OBJECTIVE

Implement strategies to advance a continued commitment in prevention of crime and reducing crime severity.

ACTIONS

Continue to monitor the crime severity index through Statistics Canada Proactive measures of enforcement - targeted patrols in high crime areas.

Bail reform and enhancement of the Compliance Checks with high risk offenders including the continued partnership with the ROPE squad.

Measure key principles of violent and non-violent crime and where they are occurring through statistical analysis.

Engaging in our schools with youth on crime prevention initiatives, safe schools protocols Continue with our proactive principles of foot, traffic and bike patrol.

Continue to work with our MCRT team (Mental Health Crisis Response Team) as a proactive approach to ensuring addiction, mental health and other supports are addressed.

PRIORITY TWO

Community Engagement and Partnerships

OBJECTIVE

To continue to implement a commitment to the wellbeing and safety of our community through positive interactions and partnerships.

ACTIONS

Have a dedicated Community Services Officer to facilitate a collaborative approach with community partners.

Develop memorandums of understanding with community partners to define our relationship, roles and responsibilities.

Utilizing Partnerships with community partners, schools and local agencies allow for a multi-disciplinary approach to delivering crime prevention initiatives and educational presentations.

Utilize Social Media and website to promote events, alerts, press releases and activities in our community.



PRIORITY THREE

Human Resources

OBJECTIVE

Develop a Human Resources Strategy to reflect diversity within our workplace and focus on the health and wellness of employees within the Smiths Falls Police Service.

ACTIONS

Continue to implement a more team approach in the workplace focusing on wellness for staff members including implementing positive strategies for wellness.

Continue with peer to peer support and peer counselling.

Having a continued succession planning within as well as opportunities for training and growth within this service.

Reaching out to members within our community with diverse backgrounds to encourage recruitment.

Ensuring support of having adequate staffing.

PRIORITY FOUR

Supporting Victims of Crime

OBJECTIVE

The Town of Smiths Falls has joined dozens of other municipalities in the province in declaring Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) an epidemic. The Smiths Falls Police Service is committed to work with all partners collaboratively to support victims of violence, the offenders and families in the prevention and reduction of Intimate Partner Violence Cases and crimes against persons..

ACTIONS

Continuing to engage and support Lanark County Interval House (LCIH) by attending Survivor Forums, engaging on Sexual Assault Domestic Violence (SADV) committee, Situation table, Probation and Parole, Victim/Witness Assistance Program (VWAP) high risk offender committee and participate in the Regional Domestic Violence Co-ordinators meeting.

Continue to have a dedicated Sergeant that oversees all domestic related incidents to review Continue to have officers trained in trauma informed interviewing techniques, engage with offenders on prevention and safety planning for victims.

Continue to utilize Victim Services and Victim Advocate to support victims of violence.

Utilize our Mobile Crisis Response Team and other community partners if addiction or mental health are playing a role.

Continue with Compliance Checks on high risk IPV offenders Bail for high risk IPV offenders.

Ensure Safety Planning is conducted with Victim Services.

Liase with our SADV partners within the hospital sexual assault team.

Education with our partners within our schools and community groups to reduce the number of Intimate Partner Violence cases and crimes against persons within our community.
