- OVERALL THERE WERE 131 CRIMINAL CHARGES LAID
- IPV CASES- 20

- MENTAL HEALTH RELATED CALLS 26 CALLS, 19 % APPREHENSION RATE WITH 46 MIN AVERAGE WAIT TIME- HIGHEST BEING 2 HR 14 MINS

 AREA- INTERCEPTED AT CALYPSO WATER PARK WHERE CHARGES WERE LAID AND A FEMALE
 ARRESTED
- SERIOUS BAIL VIOLATION CASE WHERE OFFENDER KEPT BEING RELEASED AT BAIL AND RE-OFFENDING FURTHER INVESTIGATIONS OF ALLEGATION OF ASSAULTS AND SEX ASSAULTS

CRIME UNIT/CIB- AUGUST

- CONTINUING WITH MISSING PERSON FILE- OF NOTE THE DEPUTY CHIEF HAS TAKEN OVER THE LEAD FOR SMITHS FALLS IN MEETING WITH TOP LEVEL OVERVIEW
- SIGNIFICANT ODSP FRAUD OVER \$200,000 SUSPECT IDENTIFIED
- ASSAULT THAT OCCURRED AT A LOCAL RESTAURANT AND THEN TURNED INTO AN IPV
 INVESTIGATION WHERE MALE FLED SCENE AND SUSTAINED AN INJURY- NOT SERIOUS
- SUDDEN DEATH- ASSIST CORONER IN IDENTIFYING REMAINS- NOT SUSPICIOUS
