THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF SMITHS FALLS

BY-LAW NO. 7252-97 (OFFICE CONSOLIDATION)

A By-law to regulate and control the parking of vehicles in the Town of Smiths Falls.

WHEREAS pursuant to the following sections of the Municipal Act, Chapter M.45, R.S.O. 1990, as amended, by-laws may be passed by the Councils of local municipalities for:

210(123) -regulating traffic on any highway and may prohibit or regulate the parking, standing or stopping of vehicles or any class thereof, on highways or any part of a highway;

207(56) -acquiring and laying out lands and buildings where vehicles may be parked, and for regulating and governing the parking of vehicles thereof; and

314(8) -erecting and operating on any highway or portion of a highway parking meters; and

210(125) -exempting the owners and drivers of vehicles displaying a disabled person parking permit from any provisions of by-laws regulating the parking, standing or stopping of vehicles; and

210(125) -allowing of motor vehicles on designated parts of highways for specific periods pursuant to permits issued, for charging such fee as the Council may determine and for exempting pursuant to permits issued the owners and drivers of vehicles operated by or carrying disabled persons; and

210(131) -prohibiting the parking or leaving of motor vehicles on private property without the consent of the owner or occupant of the property, and on property owned or occupied by the municipality without the consent of the municipality; and

210(52) -designating private roadways as fire routes along which no parking of vehicles shall be permitted; and

WHEREAS various provisions of the Highway Traffic Act Chapter H.8, R.S.O. 1990 as amended, apply to by-laws passed by the Councils of local municipalities respecting the prohibition, regulating and controlling of the parking, standing and stopping of vehicles on highways;

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Smiths Falls deems it expedient to regulate and control parking of vehicles in the Town of Smiths Falls;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Smiths Falls enacts as follows:

1. **DEFINITIONS**

Unless specifically modified or changed herein, words or expressions used in this by-law have the same meaning as given or used in the Highway Traffic Act, Chapter H.8, R.S.O. 1990 as amended.

For the purpose of this by-law the following definitions shall apply:

- "Accessible Parking Space" means a designated parking space identified by prescribed signage which is reserved for the exclusive use of persons with an accessible parking permit.
- "Accessible Parking Permit" means a valid permit issued by the Minister of Transportation under section 26 of the Highway Traffic Act or a valid permit, licence plate or other marker or device bearing the international symbol of access issued by a jurisdiction other than Ontario.

"Authorized Emergency Vehicle" means:

- a) a fire fighting vehicle while proceeding to or returning from a fire or emergency call;
- b) a vehicle while used by a person in the lawful performance of his duties as a police officer or firefighter
- c) an ambulance or cardiac arrest emergency vehicle while responding to an emergency call or being used to transport a patient or injured person in an emergency situation; or
- d) an emergency vehicle of a public or private utility, or Federal, Provincial or Municipal Department when such a vehicle is being used in the performance of emergency duties.
- "Authorized Sign" means any parking or traffic control device or traffic signal placed or erected on a highway under the authority of this by-law for the purpose of regulating, warning or guiding traffic and includes such signs as described in the Regulations made pursuant to the Highway Traffic Act, Chapter H.8, R.S.O, 1990, as amended.
- "Boulevard" means that part of the highway situated between the curb line and property line of the lot abutting the highway, but does not include a sidewalk, shoulder, or combined facility, if any.
- **"By-law Enforcement Officer"-** See *Municipal Law Enforcement Officer.* This reference changed as per By-law 7951-2006 and the Ontario Police Services Act.

"Chief of Police" means the Chief of Police of the Town of Smiths Falls or their designate.

"Commercial Motor Vehicle" means a motor vehicle having permanently attached thereto a truck or delivery body and includes ambulances, hearses, fire apparatus, and tractors used for hauling purposes on the highway.

"Controlled Parking Area or Lot" means those streets, or parts of streets or parking lots, or parts of parking lots on which parking, where permitted, is controlled or regulated by the use of parking meters, permits, virtual parking payments, and/or signage indicating parking restrictions.

"Corner" means the point of intersection of curbs or edges of the portion of the highway used for vehicular traffic.

"Council" means the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Smiths Falls.

"Crosswalk" means:

- a) that part of the highway at an intersection that is included within the confines
 of the lateral lines of the sidewalk on opposite sides of the highway measured
 from the curbs or, in the absence of curbs, from the edges of the roadway; or
- b) any portion of a roadway at an intersection or elsewhere distinctly indicated for pedestrian crossing by signs or by lines or other markings on the surface.

"Cul-de-sac" means a highway terminating in a turn around.

"Curb" shall include the edge of the travelled portion of the highway.

"Curb line" means:

- a) where a curb has been constructed the line of the curb; or
- b) where no curb has been constructed the edge of the roadway.

"Designated Public Building" means an apartment building, church, hospital, hotel, motel, shopping centre, rowhouse, industrial building and municipality facility and any other structure which is used for the accommodation of public or for the gathering or assembling of people. Definitions contained in the Zoning By-law of the Town shall apply equally to this by-law.

"Driver" means a person who drives a vehicle on a highway.

"Driveway" means the improved land on a highway which provides vehicular access from the roadway to adjacent land.

- "Fire Access Route" means any road, driveway, lane, ramp, or other means of vehicular access or egress and shall conform to the requirements of the Ontario Fire Code Act and Regulations thereto, as amended.
- "Fire Chief' means the Chief Fire Official of the Town of Smiths Falls or their designate.
- "Highway" includes a common and public highway, street, avenue, parkway, driveway, square, place, bridge, viaduct or trestle, any part of which is intended for or used by the general public for the passage of vehicles and includes the area between the lateral property lines thereof.
- "Intersection" means the area embraced within the prolongation or connection of the lateral curb lines or, if none, then of the lateral boundary lines of two or more highways that join one another at an angle, whether or not one highway crosses the other.
- "Island" means a portion of a highway so constructed or designed as to separate or direct vehicular traffic onto specific portions of the highway.
- "Issuing Officer" means a Police Officer, Municipal Law Enforcement Officer or a Provincial Offences Officer authorized pursuant to the Provincial Offences Act to issue a Parking Infraction Notice.
- "Median Strip" means that portion of a highway so constructed to separate traffic travelling in one direction from traffic travelling in the opposite direction by a physical barrier or a raised or depressed paved or unpaved separation area that is not intended to allow crossing vehicular movement.
- "Motor vehicle" includes an automobile, motorcycle, motor assisted bicycle unless otherwise indicated in this Act, and any other vehicle propelled or driven otherwise than by muscular power, but does not include a street car, or other motor vehicles running only upon rails, or a motorized snow vehicle, traction engine, farm tractor, self-propelled implement of husbandry or road building machine within the meaning of the Highway Traffic Act. "Vehicle" shall have a like meaning.
- "Municipal Law Enforcement Officer" are peace officers for the purpose of enforcing municipal by-laws.
- "One Way Street" means a highway upon which the movement of vehicular traffic is designated by by-law for movement in one direction only.
- "Park or Parking" when prohibited, means the standing of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except when standing temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading merchandise or passengers.

"Parking Lot" means an area of land which has been arranged, laid out or improved to provide for the parking of motor vehicles.

"Parking Meter" means a mechanical, electronic or virtual measurement device or software application installed for the purpose of:

- a) controlling and regulating the parking of any vehicle in a parking space; and
- b) measuring and indicating the parking time for which payment has been made, and signalling mechanically, electronically or virtually when such time has elapsed.

"Parking Permit" means a device displayed either physically or virtually, provided by the Town which allows the parking of vehicles in parking meter zones or controlled parking areas at no charge, at a fee established by this by-law or at a fee established other than by this by-law.

"Parking Space" means a part of the highway, the use of which is designated by signs or posts or lines or other marking on the highway or any other area used for the purpose of parking a vehicle.

"Person" means a person, firm or corporation used in the normal context of the word.

"Police Officer" means a uniformed member of the Police Services.

"Provincial Offences Officer" means a Police Officer, Peace Officer or other person lawfully appointed, pursuant to the Provincial Offences Act, to enforce the by-laws of the Corporation.

"Roadway" means the part of the highway that is improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular traffic, but does not include the shoulder, and, where a highway includes two or more separate roadways, the term "roadway" refers to any one roadway separately and not to all of the roadways collectively.

"Sidewalk" means that portion of a highway between the curb lines and the property line of the lot abutting the highway and which is intended for the use of pedestrians.

"Shoulder" means that part of the highway lying adjacent to the roadway where there is no barrier curb, and which is improved with granular or paved surface which extends for a maximum distance of 3 meters.

"Stand or Standing" where prohibited, means the halting of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except for the purpose and while actively engaged in receiving or discharging passengers.

"Street Block" means the stretch of road between streets, or the section of road from one cross street to the next.

Parking By-law No. 7252-97, Office Consolidation, May 2006

"Stop or Stopping" where prohibited means the halting of a vehicle, even momentarily, whether occupied or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a Police Officer or of a traffic control sign or signal.

"Town" means the Corporation of the Town of Smiths Falls.

"Trailer" means a vehicle that is at any time drawn upon a highway by a motor vehicle except an implement of husbandry, a mobile home, another motor vehicle or any device or apparatus not designed to transport persons or property, temporarily drawn, propelled or moved upon such highway, and except a side car attached to a motorcycle, and shall be considered a separate vehicle and not part of the motor vehicle by which it is drawn.

"Vehicle" shall have a like meaning as "Motor Vehicle" described above.

"Virtual Parking Payment" means a payment method paid in person (but recorded virtually), online, by phone application or other virtual method for the purpose of:

controlling and regulating the parking of any vehicle in a parking space; and

- a) measuring and indicating the parking time for which payment has been made, and
- b) signalling virtually when such time has elapsed.

2. TIME

2.1 Notwithstanding the Time Act, R.S.O. 1990, as amended, so long as the time commonly observed in the Town is one hour in advance of Standard Time, the times mentioned in this by-law shall be reckoned in accordance with the time so commonly observed and not Standard Time.

3. SCHEDULES AND SEVERABILITY

3.1 The Schedules A to and including S attached to this by-law shall be read with and form part of this by-law. All measurements contained in the attached schedules are referenced from the nearest intersecting highway limit unless otherwise specified therein.

3.2 Should any part, section, subsection or portion of this by-law be repealed or declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal the same shall not affect the validity of the by-law as a whole or in part thereof, except for that which was declared to be invalid.

4. METHOD OF PARKING

Direction

4.1.1 No person shall park a vehicle on any street, other than a one-way street, unless on the right-hand side of the street having regard for the direction in which the vehicle had been proceeding and unless the right front and right rear wheels or runners of the vehicle are parallel to and distant respectively not more than 15 cm from the edge of the roadway. Notwithstanding, the distance between the rear wheel and the roadway edge shall not apply where angle parking is specifically authorized by this by-law.

Parallel

4.1.2 Parallel parking is hereby authorized on all streets in the Town of Smiths Falls upon which angle parking has not been designed as per Schedule A or upon which no specific parking restrictions have been imposed pursuant to this by-law.

Angle

- 4.2.1 Angle parking is permitted on those highways or parts of highways named and described on Schedule A.
- 4.2.2 Where angle parking is permitted, no person shall park a vehicle except at an angle, consistent with the line markings and facing in the same direction of the general traffic flow from which the vehicle entered the parking space.
- 4.2.3 No vehicle of greater length than six meters shall be parked in any parking space designated for parking of vehicles at an angle to the sidewalk, curb or boulevard.

One-Way Streets

4.3.1 Where parking is permitted on a one-way street, a person may park a vehicle facing only in the direction in which it was proceeding and with the right front and right rear wheels parallel to and not more than 15 cm from the edge of the roadway, providing that this provision shall not apply where parking on the left-hand side of a one-way street is specifically authorized by by-law.

Within Parking Space

- 4.4.1 Individual parking spaces may be defined by the Town by painted lines or other suitable marks on the surface of the parking lot or roadway. Where such parking spaces are so defined, it shall be unlawful to park a vehicle other than within the confines of the parking space so defined.
- 4.4.2 It shall be unlawful for any person to cause or permit any vehicle registered in his or her name to be parked in any parking lot or on any roadway, in other than a parking space, whether or not a valid parking permit or disabled person parking permit is displayed in the vehicle as prescribed herein.

5. STOPPING PROHIBITED AT ANY TIME

- 5.1 No person shall stop or cause to be stopped any vehicle in any of the following places at any time on any day unless such stopping is explicitly permitted by painted lines on the pavement, signs or other municipal marker or at the direction of a Police Officer;
- a) On or in any sidewalk, crosswalk, boulevard, turn around of a cul-de-sac, level railway crossing or intersection;
- b) Adjacent to any island or median strip constructed on the highway;
- c) In front of a public or private driveway or within 1.5 meters of a public or private driveway;
- d) Within 6 meters of the nearest curb of any intersecting street;
- e) Within a distance of 3 meters from the closes point on the curb to any fire hydrant;
- f) Within 6 meters of a crosswalk at an intersection;
- g) Within 6 meters of a level railway crossing;
- h) On any bridge or subway or the approaches thereto;
- i) On any street in such a manner as to obstruct traffic;
- j) In such a position as to prevent the convenient removal of any other vehicle previously parked or standing;
- k) On any highway within 15m of the termination of a dead end highway;
- I) In front of the entrance to a hospital, hotel, theatre, auditorium or other building utilized for the assemblage of persons;
- m) On any roadway for a longer period than twenty-four consecutive hours regardless of compliance with any other provision of this by-law;

- n) Opposite another vehicle which is already parked, stopped or standing on the other side of the street, where the width of the travelled portion of the street, or the width between curbs is less than 11 meters or where such parking would prevent the free passage of two lanes of traffic;
- o) On any Yield Lane or within 5 meters of any Yield Lane.
 - 5.2 No person shall stop or cause to be stopped any vehicle in any of the areas designated in Schedule "S" at any time on any day unless such stopping is explicitly permitted by painted lines on the pavement, signs or other municipal marker or at the direction of a Police Officer.

6. DESIGNATED "NO PARKING" AREAS

- 6.1 Those highways and portions of highway named and described in Schedule B hereto shall be designated "No Parking" areas.
- 6.2 Where authorized signs to that effect are on display, no person shall park a vehicle at any time within the highway or portion of highway named or described in Schedule B as "No Parking" areas or in parking space with appropriate barriers and No Parking signs installed.
- 6.3 Where authorized signs to that effect are on display, no person shall park a vehicle within the highway or portion of highway named or described in Schedules C during the time period for which such parking restrictions are in effect, as indicated in the said Schedule.

7. FIRE ACCESS ROUTES

- 7.1 No person shall stop or park a vehicle on a designated fire route as described in at least one of the provisions below and where stopping or parking is prohibited by an authorized or approved sign marking it a fire route:
 - a) Where identified in the approved site plan for the property; or
 - b) Where required under the Building and Fire Codes and agreed by the property owner and the Fire Chief where the Fire Route meets the minimum requirements as set out in the Fire Code
- 7.2 Where authorized signs to that effect are on display, no person shall park a vehicle within or so as to obstruct a fire access route.

8. NO PARKING DURING WINTER MONTHS

8.1 In any year during the period beginning November 15th or the first day in November that there is a winter snow and/or ice event and ending March 31 in any year, it shall be unlawful to park a vehicle in any Controlled Parking

Lot (where signage indicates) described in Schedule K, or on any highway between the hours of twelve o'clock midnight and seven o'clock in the morning. A winter event in any day when there is a need for the Works & Utilities department to perform winter snow and/or ice control and/or snow removal. Examples of this would be sanding, salting, plowing, snow removal.

9. RESTRICTED PARKING

- 9.1 Those highways or portions of highways named and described in Schedules F and G shall be designated as "Restricted Parking" areas.
- 9.3 Where authorized signs to that effect are on display, no person shall park a vehicle within the highway or portion of highway named or described in Schedule F for a longer period of time than two hours, during the time, indicated on the said Schedule, for which such parking restrictions are in effect.
- 9.4 Where authorized signs to that effect are on display, no person shall park a vehicle within the highway or portion of highway named or described in Schedule G for a longer period of time than indicated, during the time, indicated on the said Schedule, for which such parking restrictions are in effect.
- 9.5 No person shall park on any local road, as defined by the Official Plan of the Town of Smiths Falls, a heavy vehicle, in excess of 5,000 kg vehicle weight, for a period longer than two (2) hours, which is likely to detract from the quality of life in the neighbourhood.

10A. COMMERCIAL LOADING ZONES

- $1\mathrm{OA}.1$ Those portions of highways named and described in Schedule H shall be designated as Loading Zones.
- 1OA.2 Where authorized signs have been erected and are on display, no person shall stand or park any vehicle, other than a commercial vehicle or authorized emergency vehicle, in any area designated as a loading zone. No person shall park a commercial vehicle in a loading zoned for a period exceeding the actual time required to load or unload the commercial vehicle or thirty (30) minutes which ever is the shorter.

10B PASSENGER LOADING ZONES

10B.1 Those portions of highways named and described in Schedule H(B) shall be designated as Passenger Loading Zones.

10B.2 Where authorized signs have been erected and are on display, no person shall stand or park any vehicle in any area designated as a passenger loading zoned for any purpose other than to load and unload persons from a standard passenger vehicle. While so parked, such passenger vehicle shall display its four-way flashing emergency lights. No person shall stand or park a passenger vehicle in a passenger loading zone for a period exceeding the actual time required to load or unload such persons or five (5) minutes which ever is the shorter.

11. SCHOOL BUS LOADING ZONES

- 11.1 Those portions of highways named and described in Schedule I shall be designated as School Bus Loading Zones. Such School Bus Loading Zone designations shall apply between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive. The School Bus Loading Zone designation shall be considered an overlay designation imposed in addition to other parking restrictions contained herein. At all other times and days, parking in such designated School Bus Loading Zones shall be in compliance with the provisions of this by-law.
- 11.2 Where authorized signs have been erected and are on display, no person shall stand or park any vehicle, other than a school bus, in any area designated as a School Bus Loading Zone.

12. BUS LAYBY

- 12.1 Where authorized signs gave been erected and are on display, no person shall permit a vehicle to enter, stand, stop or be parked on the highways or portions of highways named and described in Schedule J.
- 12.2 Notwithstanding section 12.1, buses, school buses and taxis shall be permitted to enter into the designated area for the sole purpose of loading and discharging passengers. No driver or operator of a bus, school bus or taxi shall permit a vehicle to stand, stop or be parked in such described areas for a period of time in excess of the time actually required to load or discharge passengers.

13. PARKING ON PRIVATE LANDS

- 13.1 No person shall park or leave any vehicle on private property without the written consent of the owner or occupant of such property.
- 13.2 Where an owner or occupant of property, as defined in Section 13.1 of the Municipal Act has posted signs stating conditions on which a motor vehicle may be parked or left on the property or prohibiting the parking or leaving of a motor vehicle on the property, a motor vehicle parked or left on

the property contrary to such conditions or prohibitions shall be deemed to have been parked or left without the owner or occupant's consent.

13.3 The Town may appoint a person who is not an employee of the municipality as a municipal law enforcement officer under section 15 of the Police Services Act for enforcing the provisions of this section of the by-law. The Town shall, through the adoption and implementation of a Deputization Program for Parking Infractions on Private Property, ensure that the person appointed is properly trained to perform the duties arising out of the appointment.

14. PARKING MUNICIPAL OWNED LANDS

- 14.1 No person shall park or leave any vehicle on municipally owned or controlled property without the written consent of the Town.
- 14.2 Vehicles parked on municipally owned or controlled lands, in accordance with the provisions of this section or section 15 "Controlled Parking Lots" shall be deemed to be parked with the consent of the Town.
- 14.3 Where authorized signs have been erected and are on display, no person shall park or leave any vehicle in the off-street parking lots or vacant lands adjacent to and associated with the following municipal facilities unless such person is an employee or elected official of the municipality engaged in municipal business or such person is, at the time the vehicle is parked or left, actively participating in the activities currently being provided in or on the municipal property or engaged by such patron to provide transportation:
 - Municipal Complex/Kinsmen Park Beckwith Street North
 - Memorial Community Centre Elmsley Street North
 - · Youth Centre Elmsley Street North
 - · Child Development Centre Thurber Street
 - · Heritage House Museum Old Slys Road
 - Public Works Garage Beckwith Street North
 - · Clark Building William Street West
 - · Smiths Falls Public Library Beckwith Street North
 - · Centennial Park Centennial Drive
 - Victoria Park Lombard Street
 - Alexander Park Alexander Street
 - Lower Reach Park Old Slys Road/Jasper Avenue
 - · Hyland Park Empress Avenue
 - Corbett Field Sussex Street
 - Toboggan Hill Eric Hutcheson Road/Hydro Substation Road
 - · Municipal Airport Township of Montague/North Gower Road
 - Hillcrest Cemetery- Township of North Elmsley
 - · Rideau Canal Museum Beckwith Street North

- 14.4 Notwithstanding section 14.3 signs may be posted by the Town defining certain parking spaces within the lands associated with the facilities as being reserved for use by certain classes of vehicles and such use shall be clearly marked on the sign. No person shall park any vehicle, other than the class of vehicle marked on the sign, in any parking space so reserved.
- 14.5 Vehicles parked on municipally owned or controlled lands, contrary to the provisions of this section or section 15 "Controlled Parking Lots" shall be deemed to be parked without the consent of the Town unless and until written consent is otherwise provided by the Chief of Police or a Municipal Law Enforcement Officer.

15. CONTROLLED PARKING LOTS

- 15.1 Those lands, more particularly described in Schedule K, owned or leased by the Town of Smiths Falls, are hereby designated as controlled parking lots.
- 15.2 No person shall park a vehicle in any parking space in any controlled parking lot until an hourly, daily or monthly fee, as prescribed in Schedule K, has been paid to the Treasurer, the Parking Meter (if applicable), or secured by a Virtual Parking Payment. If a physical permit was purchased and is valid, it must be legible and displayed visibly on the front dash, sun visor, or rear view mirror, in accordance with the terms of this by-law.
- 15.3 The method of payment for the use of a parking space in a controlled parking lot, as set out in section 15.2 (a) shall apply only where payment is being made on such basis at the time of the passing of this by-law and shall cease to be available upon non-payment of the prescribed fee in advance or by resolution for this Council upon the furnishing of two (2) months written notice.
- 15.4 Vehicles for which payment for parking is made on a monthly basis shall be parked in that area of the Controlled Parking Lot designated and signed for monthly permit holders only.
- 15.5 Every person paying for parking privileges on a monthly basis shall be furnished with a receipt which shall be displayed on the front dash or extended sun visor so as to be clearly visible from the exterior of the vehicle. If a permit has been obtained via a Virtual Parking Payment, proof of payment and validity will be obtained virtually.
- 15.6 All vehicles shall be properly parked in a parking space in a manner that will not create a hazard or nuisance. No vehicle shall be parked in the area

signed for monthly permit holders only except vehicles for which payment for parking privileges is made on a monthly basis.

- 15.8 No person shall permit a vehicle to remain parked in a parking space in any Controlled Parking Lot for a longer period of time than that for which payment has been made in the form of payment to the Parking Meter (if applicable) or via Virtual Parking Payment and for which time the permit is properly displayed visibly or the validity is confirmed virtually.
- 15.9 A vehicle shall be considered illegally parked in any parking space in a Controlled Parking Lot when the time paid for the parking permit has expired.
- 15.10 No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited in the Parking Permit Dispenser any slug, device or other substitute for a coin of Canada or the United States.
- 15.11 No person shall park a vehicle in such a manner that is not wholly within an area designated as a Parking Space and if a vehicle is of such length as to prevent it from being parked within one parking space, then the owner or operator shall purchase a separate numbered parking permit for each and every parking space or part thereof occupied by the vehicle.

16. ON-STREET PARKING IN THE DOWNTOWN BUSINESS ASSOCIATION BOUNDARY

- 16.8 No person shall park a vehicle, for a period of time in excess of two hours, on those highways or portions of highways named and described in Schedule M, regardless of any fee paid, except if the parking space(s) have been rented as per Section 18.
- 16.9 No person shall park a vehicle in the same street block, for a period of time in excess of 2 hours, on those highways or portions of highways named and described in Schedule M, regardless of any fee paid except if the parking space(s) have been rented as per Section 18.
- 16.10 No person shall park a vehicle in the same street block, for a period of time in excess of 3 hours, on those highways or portions of highways named and described in Schedule N, regardless of any fee paid except if the parking space(s) have been rented as per Section 18.
- 16.11 No person shall park a vehicle in parking space where appropriate barriers and No Parking signs installed.
- 16.12 Notwithstanding Section 16.8 and Section 16.9, Veterans will be permitted to park a vehicle in excess of two hours on Remembrance Day only.

17. PARKING PERMITS

- 17.1 The Town may make available parking permits for the parking of vehicles in the specified parking areas as defined in this by-law.
- 17.2 Notwithstanding any of the provisions contained in this by-law, the Municipal Law Enforcement Officer or other person or agency authorized by the Clerk to do so, may issue parking permits and the holder of said permits shall be permitted to park in parking areas specified on the face of the permit except designated parking spaces, without being required to pay for such parking privileges, during the period for which the said parking permit is valid.
- 17.4 Issuance of a parking permit shall not be construed as permission to park any vehicle in any manner other than that dictated in the section of this by-law titled Method of Parking. Failure to comply with the provisions of this by-law shall be reason enough for the revocation of such parking permit. The Clerk shall notify the Permit Holder of such revocation.
- 17.5 A valid parking permit shall be displayed on front dash of the vehicle or on the front of an extended sun visor so as to be readily visible from the exterior of the vehicle. If a virtual parking payment was made, its validity will be displayed virtually to the by-law enforcement officer. Failure by the driver or owner to display the parking permit in this manner shall void all privileges associated with the issuance of permit.

18. PARKING SPACERENTALS

- 18.1 The Town may, upon application, enter into agreements to rent parking spaces on a street or parking lot on a short or longer-term basis to persons who meet the eligibility criteria and upon payment of the prescribed fee set forth in Schedule Q to this by-law.
- 18.2 Failure to return any equipment (barriers, cones, signage, etc.) on expiration of the time for which it/they were rented shall result in additional rental charges being levied until said equipment is satisfactorily accounted for or returned to the Town.
- 18.3 Should the equipment not be accounted for, the person having rented the hood(s) shall forfeit the deposit.
- 18.4 No person shall park a vehicle in a parking space where barricades, cones and/or signage has been lawfully installed other than for the purpose of participating in the event for which the parking space rental was issued.

19. ACCESSIBLE PARKING

- 19.1 The parking spaces identified in Schedule R hereto shall be designated parking spaces for the sole use of persons with an accessible parking permit. Such designated parking spaces shall be clearly marked by a sign depicting the international symbol of access for the disabled.
- 19.2 No person shall park a vehicle in any designated parking space unless the following conditions have been met:
- a) the owner or driver of the vehicle parks the vehicle in such a manner as to comply with the section of this by-law entitled Method of Parking
- b) the vehicle is operated by the holder of an accessible parking permit or by a person engaged to pick or transport the holder of an accessible parking permit
- c) the valid accessible parking permit is displayed on the front dash of the vehicle or the front of an extended sun visor so as to be clearly visible from the exterior of the vehicle.
- 19.3 It shall be unlawful for any person to use or display an accessible parking permit in any fashion other than for which the permit was issued.

20. MUNICIPAL VEHICLES EXEMPTION

20.1 Any vehicle owned by the Town of Smiths Falls, the Smiths Falls Water Commission or Smiths Falls Hydro Commission and any authorized emergency vehicle shall be permitted to park in any parking space, metered parking space or controlled parking lot and the operator of such vehicle shall not be required to deposit any coins in the meter adjacent to any such parked vehicle nor display a parking permit, provided always that the said vehicle displays, on the exterior of the vehicle, a recognized symbol of the Town or wording announcing the ownership of the vehicle and is being used in the performance of municipal duties.

21. EMERGENCY PROHIBITION

- 21.1 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, the Chief of Police, Fire Chief, Director of Public Works or Municipal Law Enforcement Officer, during any emergency or special circumstance may;
- a) prohibit any or all parking on a highway within the area affected by the emergency or special circumstances;
- b) authorize the erection of temporary "No Parking" signs or barricades on any highway or portion of highway; or

- declare that any vehicle already parked is parked illegally regardless of the time permitted for parking such vehicle under the provisions of this bylaw.
- 21.2 Where possible, the owner of driver of a vehicle declared to be illegally parked shall be notified by a Police Officer or Municipal Law Enforcement Officer that such parking has been prohibited and shall be ordered to remove the vehicle immediately.
- 21.3 Where the owner or driver so notified to remove the vehicle does not do so or where the owner or driver cannot immediately be located, the said vehicle declared to be parked illegally may be revoked and impounded forthwith by an order of a Police Officer in accordance with section 27.1 of this by-law entitled Removal of Illegally Parked Vehicle. Where, in the opinion of the Officer, the vehicle owner has not voluntarily contravened the police directive the costs associated with towing and impounding will be borne by the Town.

22. AUTHORIZ ED SIGNS AND PARKING CONTROL DEVICES

- 22.1 The Town shall erect all authorized signs and other parking control devices necessary for the lawful implementation and enforcement of this bylaw.
- 22.2 No person shall place, maintain or display upon or in view of any highway any sign, signal, marking or device which purports to be or is an imitation or resembles any authorized sign or parking control device.
- 22.3 No person shall damage, deface or tamper with any authorized sign, parking meter, parking permit dispenser or other parking control device and no unauthorized person shall move, open or attempt to open the same.

23. RESERVE FUND

- 23.1 A Parking Reserve Fund is hereby established in accordance with Section 207(56) of the Municipal Act, Chapter M.45, R.S.O. 1990.
- 23.2 The net revenue derived from the operation of all parking facilities operated by the Town for parking purposes, including parking meters, shall be deposited in the Parking Reserve Fund.
- 23.3 Such Parking Reserve Fund shall be applied,
- a) firstly, for the payment of interest and principal falling due in each year in respect of any debentures issued for the purposes of this paragraph, and
- b) secondly, for the acquisition, establishment, laying out or improvement of additional parking lots or facilities, and

c) thirdly, for such other purposes as the Town may approve.

24. OFFENCES

- 24.1 Any person found to be in contravention of this by-law either by doing any act forbidden or by failing to do any act required by this by-law, is guilty of an offence.
- 24.2 The driver of a vehicle, not being the owner, is liable to any penalty provided under this by-law and the owner of the motor vehicle is also liable to such a penalty unless at the time of the offence was committed the motor vehicle was in the possession of a person other than the owner without the owner's consent.

25. PARKING INFRACTION NOTICE

- 25.1 There a vehicle is found to be in contravention of the parking or stopping provisions of this by-law the Issuing Officer may issue and place on the vehicle a serially numbered Parking Infraction Notice in the form prescribed by the Provincial Offences Act.
- 25.2 The serially numbered Parking Infraction Notice shall state:
- a) the licence number and description of the vehicle;
- b) the nature of the alleged infraction;
- c) the date, time and place of the alleged infraction;
- d) the set fine provided therein for the violation;
- e) the owner shall within fifteen (15) days pay the set fine provided for the infraction by taking it or forwarding it to the Tax Office at the Town's Municipal Complex during regular office hours, Monday to Friday inclusive, excepting always statutory holidays, or by other payment methods available, such as by mail or online.
- 25.3 The Parking Infraction Notice mentioned in section 25.2 above shall be prepared as required and the Issuing Officer shall attach one copy to the vehicle and retain another copy, either paper or electronic, for further processing in accordance with the Provincial Offences Act.
- 25.4 If payment is not made in accordance with the procedure set out on the Parking Infraction Notice provided for in section 25.2 above, the Provincial Offences Act as amended shall apply.

26. PENALTIES

26.1 Any person violating any of the provisions of this by-law is guilty of an offence and on conviction shall be liable to a penalty pursuant to the Provincial Offences Act.

26.2 Set fines may be established for certain offences contained in this bylaw. Such set fines shall be established pursuant to the Provincial Offences Act and shall become effective upon the approval of same by the Chief Judge of the Provincial Offences Court.

27. REMOVAL OF ILLEGALLY PARKED VEHICLE

27.1 An addition to the penalties imposed pursuant to section 25 of this by-law, vehicles parked in contravention of the provisions of this by-law may be tagged and towed away, at the owner's expense, by order of a Police Officer, in accordance with section 170(15) of the Highway Traffic Act, Chapter H.8, R.S.O. 1990.

28. ENFORCEMENT AND AUTHORITY

- 28.1 The provisions of this by-law shall be enforced by the Municipal Law Enforcement Officers and Police Officers appointed by the Town and the Smiths Falls Police Service Board respectively.
- 28.2 The Chief of Police shall be responsible for implementation of the Deputization Program and for making recommendations to the Town for the appointment of persons successfully completing the requirements of the Program.

29. BY-LAWS REPEALED

29.1 By-law No. 5919-93 is hereby rescinded.

30. SHORT TITLE

30.1 This by-law may be cited as "The Parking By-law"

31. EFFECTIVE DATE

31.1 The provisions of this by-law shall come into force and take effect on the final passing thereof. Notwithstanding, preprinted parking offence notices (parking tickets) referencing By-law No. 5919-93 shall continue as valid until such time as they have been completely expended.

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF SMITHS FALLS BY-LAW NO. 10435-2023

BY-LAW TO AUTHORIZE AN AMENDMENT TO PARKING BY-LAW 7252-97 RESPECTING THE AUTHORITY TO TOW VEHICLES

WHEREAS Section 11 (3) 8 of the Municipal Act, SO 2001, as amended authorizes municipalities to pass By-laws regulating Parking, except on highways;

WHEREAS Council of the Town of Smiths Falls passed By-law No. 7252-97, as amended pursuant to various sections of the Municipal Act and Highway Traffic Act thereby regulating traffic and parking, standing or stopping of vehicles, or any class thereof;

AND WHEREAS the Town of Smiths Falls Parking By-law provides that vehicles parked in contravention of the provisions of the Parking By-law may be tagged and towed away by the order of a Police Officer;

AND WHEREAS it is recommended that delegated authority to Municipal By-law Officers be granted to tow vehicles as outlined in Report 2023-38.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Smiths Falls enacts as follows:

1. THAT Section 11 of Bylaw 7252-97 as amended be further amended as follows:

11 REMOVAL OF ILLEGALLY PARKED VEHICLE

11.1 An addition to the penalties imposed pursuant to section 25 of this by-law, vehicles parked in contravention of the provisions of this by-law may be tagged and towed away, at the owner's expense, by order of a Town of Smiths Falls By-law Enforcement Officer or Police Officer, in accordance with section 170(15) of the Highway Traffic Act, Chapter H.8, R.S.O. 1990.

- 12 THAT all other provisions of the By-law remain in effect;
- 13 THAT the provisions of this By-law shall come into force and take effect on the passing thereof until further notice.
