

- 29 MAY 2025 – CALL RECEIVED OF A SUICIDAL PERSON IN DISTRESS AT THE DOG PARK AREA IN THE VICINITY OF THE CURLING CLUB
- REPORT THAT THE PERSON WAS BLEEDING FROM THE NECK AND WRISTS
- OFFICERS FRASER / JACKSON AND MCCLOY ATTENDED WITHIN MINUTES
- SUBJECT LOCATED IN THE BUSH BEHIND THE CURLING CLUB – BLEEDING PROFUSELY FROM WOUNDS TO NECK AND BOTH WRISTS
- LARGE KNIFE LOCATED IN THE VICINITY OF THE SUBJECT
- IMMEDIATE FIRST AID WAS INITIATED BY THE OFFICERS TO SUPPRESS THE BLEEDING AND KEEP THE SUBJECT CALM
- EMS ATTENDED AND TOOK OVER EMERGENCY FIRST AID FROM OFFICERS
- SUBJECT TRANSPORTED TO SMITHS FALLS HOSPITAL AND UNDERWENT EMERGENCY SURGERY FOR THE INJURIES
- SUBJECT LIFE WAS SAVED DIRECTLY DUE TO THE QUICK AND DECISIVE ACTIONS OF THE NOTED OFFICERS

ASSIST BY-LAW AND FIRE

- 30 MAY 2025 – ONGOING PROPERTY STANDARDS VIOLATION INVESTIGATION
- BY-LAW AND FIRE DEPARTMENT HAD BEEN MET WITH BELLIGERENT AND UPSET RESIDENCE OCCUPANTS WHEN ATTEMPTING TO SERVE THE INITIAL BYLAW ORDER
- SMITHS FALLS POLICE COORDINATED WITH BYLAW AND FIRE TO SUPPORT THE EXECUTION OF THE PROPERTY STANDARDS ORDER / CLEAN UP
- TENSE SITUATION DEVELOPED AT THE SCENE REQUIRING 6 POLICE OFFICERS TO ATTEND TO PREVENT BREACH OF PEACE AND PROVIDE SAFETY AND SECURITY TO THE ASSIGNED COMPANIES WHO WERE ASSISTING IN THE CLEAN UP
- ORDER WAS COMPLETED AND PROPERTY CLEANED UP AS REQUIRED
