CALLS FOR SERVICE

- FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER POLICE RESPONDED TO 690 CALLS FOR SERVICE.

NOTEWORTHY CALLS FOR SERVICE – SEPTEMBER

- OVERALL THERE WERE 136 CRIMINAL CHARGES LAID (HIGHEST NUMBER THIS YEAR)
- IPV CASES- 20
- ASSAULTS- 11
- BREAK AND ENTER- 3 (2 HAVE BEEN CLEARED)
- BAIL VIOLATIONS- 6
- SEXUAL ASSAULTS- 1

MENTAL HEALTH ACT INCIDENTS

- 44 CALLS FOR SERVICE, 39 % APPREHENSION RATE WITH 1.5 HOUR AVERAGE WAIT TIME- HIGHEST BEING 7 HOURS
- SEPTEMBER SHOWED A SIGNIFICANT INCREASE IN ALL AREAS (CALLS, APPREHENSION RATE AND WAIT TIME) FROM LAST REPORTING (26 CALLS, 19% APPREHENSION, 3 HOURS LONGEST WAIT TIME)
